Title: Ethical Practices and Communicating Effectively: The Subject of Sex (Panel Discussion)

This lecture is designed to open your mind, help you communicate better, and understand the clinical importance of addressing with your patients the surrounding topics under the vast umbrella of "sex." Knowing how to broach this subject ethically & appropriately is essential, always. This lecture will talk about orientation, abuse, pleasure, fertility, growth, side effects, as well as sexual practices that are extremely healthy in our relationships and what impact this has on the body. As a general practitioner, these subjects affect your entire patient population, and navigating them correctly can keep you in compliance and help your patients. Allow us to empower you so we as a profession can continue to support, guide, and communicate with our patients about sometimes challenging, complex, and even funny situations.

Course Objectives:

- Strategies for addressing boundary violations sensitively and professionally.

- Define sexual harassment and misconduct in healthcare.
- Review reporting procedures for addressing sexual harassment and misconduct.
- Examine case studies illustrating boundary challenges in healthcare.
